
He Came to My House, is a workbook with accompanying PowerPoints and sermon outlines that a financial advisor and church treasurer, Tracy John, wrote for us.

### **Mel Rees Institute**

Mel Rees was a leading writer and proponent of stewardship education in the Seventh-day Adventist denomination during the second half of the 20th century. The Mel Rees Papers provides a good sample of many of his writings on this topic. His writings were translated into various languages for use around the world.

The North American Division Stewardship Department was instrumental in placing a collection of Mel Rees' works in the Center for Adventist Research. Portions of this collection are located on the NAD Stewardship Department's web page. The collection is also available on the Adventist Digital Library.
